


A LETTER FROM THE DIRECTOR OF GOLF

LADIES' GOLF

LADIES WWGA 18 HOLE GOLF ASSOCIATION OVERVIEW

DATES: The 18 Hole Willoughby Women's Golf Association runs weekly golf events on Thursday mornings. The season begins on Opening Day, November 3rd and concludes with Closing Day May 4th. The majority of WWGA events have an 8:45am shotgun start. Dues are \$85 per player which is used for prize money throughout the season.

ELIGIBILITY: All Full Equity and NR Full Golf Members with an established handicap of 40 (index 36.0) or less are encouraged to join. Any woman currently a member of the WWGA will be automatically grand-fathered in for the upcoming year even if her handicap now exceeds 40.

FORMAT: Formats vary week-to-week and include individual and team games with net and gross prizes. The event schedule and detailed booklet will be distributed on Ladies Opening Day.

TEES: All WWGA members play from the SILVER Tees.

REGISTRATION: Invitations are emailed to all eligible golf members. Dues will be billed on your September statement and must be paid no later than September 30th to ensure your information is included in the WWGA Membership book which is distributed on Ladies Opening Day. Applications will also be available in the Golf Shop.

WEEKLY SIGN-UPS: Sign-up sheets are posted in the ladies locker room one week prior to the event. (Major events are posted earlier.) The deadline to sign-up is Tuesday by 5:00pm. You may call the Golf Shop to inquire if any spots are available after the deadline. Please call the Golf Shop no later than 8:00am Thursday if it is necessary to cancel. Weekly prizes are awarded as credit in the Golf Shop. Winners are posted in the ladies locker room and on the WGC website.

F&B: Members are strongly encouraged to stay for lunch on Ladies Day. It is assumed you will be staying unless you indicate "NO" on the sign-up sheet. Scoring and lunch will immediately follow play.

LADIES "NINERS" 9 HOLE GOLF ASSOCIATION OVERVIEW

DATES: The Women's Nine Hole Golf Association runs weekly golf events on Thursday afternoons. The season begins on Opening Day, November 3rd and concludes with Closing Day on May 4th. The majority of Niner's events have a 1:00pm shotgun start. Dues are \$70 per player. Members will also be charged \$5.00 per week for prize money.

ELIGIBILITY: All Golf Members are encouraged to join.

FORMAT: Weekly games include individual and team games primarily with net prizes. The event schedule and detailed booklet will be distributed on Ladies Opening Day.

TEES: All Niner's members play from the SILVER Tees.

REGISTRATION: The Nine Hole Ladies Association emails invitations to all eligible members. Dues must be paid no later than September 30th to ensure your information is included in the Niner's Membership book which is distributed on Ladies Opening Day. Applications will also be available in the Golf Shop.

WEEKLY SIGN-UPS: Sign-up sheets are posted in the ladies locker room one week prior to the event. (Major events are posted earlier.) The deadline to sign-up is Tuesday at 5:00pm. You may call the Golf Shop to inquire if any spots are available after the deadline. Winners are posted in the ladies locker room and on the WGC website.

F&B: Members are strongly encouraged to come for lunch on Ladies Day. It is assumed you will be coming for lunch unless you indicate "NO" on the sign-up sheet.

LADIES' PRESIDENT'S CUP

DATES: Tuesday and Thursday, November 15th and 17th

TIME: 12:30pm shotgun on Tuesday, 11:00am shotgun on Thursday

ELIGIBILITY: All categories of Golf Members.

FORMAT: Pick your partner event. The field is divided into flights of four teams each, based on the teams' combined handicap index. Teams compete in a Round Robin Format consisting of four 9-Hole Matches; two on Tuesday and two on Thursday. The format is a better ball of the two-woman team in match play. Matches are handicapped off the low handicap player in each foursome. She will play to scratch and give the difference in strokes to the other players with a maximum of one stroke per hole for each match. After completion of the matches, all flight winners will compete in a 3-Hole shoot-out to determine the Overall Champions. Payouts will be made to Flight Winners, Overall Champions, Overall Runner-Ups, and also to the teams that came from the Overall Champion's flight.

TEES: Participants will play from the silver tees.

SIGN UP: Registration begins on Monday, October 17th and ends at 5:00pm on Friday, November 11th. Applications will be available in the Golf Shop. There is a 12 team maximum so sign up early.

ENTRY FEE: \$100 cash per player for tournament fees must be paid to the Golf Shop by Friday, November 11th. There will also be a Member Charge of \$25 for the hors d'oeuvres and Awards reception immediately following play Thursday on the Patio. (Applicable cart, green fees and tax also applies.)

LADIES' MEMBER-MEMBER

DATES: Tuesday, February 7th through Saturday, February 11th

TIME: Pairings Party - Tuesday, February 7th from 6:00-8:00pm. Round 1 - Wednesday, February 8th, 12:30pm shotgun start and Round 2 - Friday, February 10th, 9:30am shotgun start. Awards Dinner Dance - Saturday, February 11th 6:00pm.

LADIES' GOLF

ELIGIBILITY: All Full Equity and NR Full Golf Members. Emeritus, Associate Equity and Executive members are eligible on a space available basis. The maximum ladies handicap for this event is 40.

FORMAT: Pick your Partner Event. Round 1 - 18 holes Better

Ball of Partners (85% handicap). Round 2 - 18 holes of Chapman/ Pinehurst. This is a 36-hole Net Championship. Flights are determined by each team's total handicap index. All Low Net Flight Winners participate in a three-hole aggregate playoff to determine the Overall Ladies Champions.

TEES: All Ladies will play from the SILVER Tees.

SIGN UP: Registration begins on Monday, January 2nd and ends at 1:00pm on Friday, February 3rd. Applications will be available in the Golf Shop.

ENTRY FEE: \$200 per player (plus tax and applicable cart and green fees) includes Pairings Party on Tuesday night (Heavy Hors d' Oeuvres, and Food Stations), action stations and on-course snacks both tournament days, daily and overall prizes and the Awards Dinner Dance on Saturday night. Non-playing spouses of contestants are invited to attend the Pairings Party (\$45) and/or Awards Dinner Dance (\$60).

F&B: Attire for both the Pairings Party and the Awards Dinner Dance is Country Club Casual. Reservations are not required for the Pairings Party but **are** required for the Awards Dinner Dance. Reservations are also required for any non-golfing spouses attending either event. Drinks-and grab and go snacks will be available on-course for both tournament days.

FORMAT: Pick your Partner Event. Round 1 - 9 holes of Better Ball of Partners. Round 2 - 9 holes of Scramble. This is an 18-hole Net Championship. Flights are determined by each team's total handicap index.

TEES: All Ladies will play from the SILVER Tees.

SIGN UP: Registration begins on Monday, January 2nd and ends at 1:00pm on Friday, February 3rd. Applications will be available in the Golf Shop.

ENTRY FEE: \$200 per player (plus tax and applicable cart and green fees) includes Pairings Party on Tuesday night (Heavy Hors d' Oeuvres and Food Stations), action stations and on-course snacks both tournament days, daily and overall prizes and the Awards Dinner Dance on Saturday night. Non-playing spouses of contestants are invited to attend the Pairings Party (\$45) and/or Awards Dinner Dance (\$60).

F&B: Attire for both the Pairings Party and the Awards Dinner Dance is Country Club Casual. Reservations are not required for the Pairings Party but *are* required for the Awards Dinner Dance. The Championship Flight will play gross matches (no strokes) and all subsequent flights are handicapped, stroking off the low player in the match - 100% handicap.

TEES: All Ladies will play from the SILVER Tees.

SIGN UP: Registration begins on Monday, February 6th and ends at 5:00pm on Sunday, March 5th. Sign up in the Ladies Locker Room.

ENTRY FEE: None

F&B: Hors d'oeuvres and Awards will be presented at the Cabana after the final matches on Sunday afternoon. Members are encouraged to stay for dinner at the Cabana. Please make reservations.

LADIES' 9-HOLERS CLUB CHAMPIONSHIP

TEES: All Ladies will play from the SILVER Tees.

SIGN UP: Registration begins on Monday, February 6th and ends at 5:00pm on Sunday, March 5th. Sign up in the Ladies Locker Room.

ENTRY FEE: None

F&B: Hors d'oeuvres and Awards will be presented at the Cabana after the final matches. Members are encouraged to stay for dinner at the Cabana. Please make reservations.

MEN'S DAY OVERVIEW

DATES: Weekly golf events for Men on Tuesday mornings beginning with Men's Opening Day.

ELIGIBILITY: Full Equity and NR Full Golf Members (Emeritus, and Associate Equity members are eligible to play through December 14th)

FORMAT: Formats vary week-to-week and include individual and team games with gross and net prizes.

REGISTRATION: Sign-up sheets will be posted in the Men's locker room one week prior to the event.

ENTRY FEE: Varies for each event. Please refer to sign-up sheets.

ERRIE BALL CHALLENGE AT PIPER'S LANDING

DATE: Wednesday, October 19th

TIME: 7:30am Breakfast 8:45am Shotgun

ELIGIBILITY: Full Equity, NR Full Golf, Emeritus and Associate Equity Members

FORMAT: Ryder Cup style event against Piper's Landing with two 9-Hole Matches. Partners will remain the same for both matches but opponents will change after the first match. Match 1 is Better Ball of Partners, Match 2 is Individual Match Play. Teams are based on handicap indexes, low to high. The winning Club is determined by the team with the most points at the completion of the second match. They will receive the honor of holding the trophy at their club until the following year.

TEES: All play will be from the tournament tee blocks.

SIGN UP: Registration begins on Monday, September 19th and ends at 1:00pm on Friday, October 14th. Sign up in the Men's Locker Room.

ENTRY FEE: \$75 per player inclusive.

F&B: Includes breakfast, lunch and awards immediately following play.

MEN'S OPENING DAY

DATE: Tuesday, November 1st

TIME: 8:45am Shotgun

ELIGIBILITY: Full Equity, NR Full Golf, Emeritus, and Associate Equity members.

FORMAT: ABCD - Two net best balls of four (85% handicap). Closest to the pins will also be awarded. There will also be an optional net Skins game available.

TEES: Participants will play from their usual tee position.

SIGN UP: Registration begins on Monday, October 3rd and ends at 1:00pm on Sunday, October 30th. Sign up in the Men's Locker Room.

ENTRY FEE: \$25.00 for credit book prizes plus applicable cart fees. Additional fees apply for the Awards luncheon.

F&B: Members are strongly encouraged to stay for lunch. It is assumed you will be staying unless you indicate "NO" on the sign-up sheet. Scoring and lunch will immediately follow play.

MEN'S FALL GUEST DAY

DATE: December 13th

TIME: 8:45am Shotgun

ELIGIBILITY: Full Equity, NR Full Golf, Emeritus, and Associate Equity members.

FORMAT: Two net best balls of four (85% handicap) in flights. Closest to the pin contests will be awarded to members and guests. 1-3 guests allowed per member. Teams will be flighted based on total team handicap index.

TEES: Members will play from their usual tee position and the tee position for guests will be based on their respective handicaps.

SIGN UP: Registration begins on Monday, November 14th and ends at 1:00pm on Sunday, December 11th. Applications will be available in the Golf Shop. Guests must have a verifiable USGA handicap.

ENTRY FEE: \$150 per player (plus tax and any applicable member cart and green fees). Includes guest cart and green fees, favors, full breakfast, on-course snacks, beer, gratuities, prizes and awards luncheon.

F&B: Registration and breakfast begins at 7:30am in the Grill Room. Drinks and snacks will be available on-course throughout the day. Scoring and Awards luncheon immediately follows play in the Main Dining Room.

MEN'S PRESIDENT'S CUP

DATES: Tuesday and Thursday, November 15th and 17th

TIME: 12:30pm shotgun on Tuesday. 11:00am shotgun on Thursday.

ELIGIBILITY: All categories of Golf Members.

FORMAT: Pick your partner event. The field is divided into flights of four teams each, based on the teams' combined handicap index. Teams compete in a Round Robin Format consisting of four 9-Hole Matches; two on Tuesday and two on Thursday. The format is a better ball of the two-man team in match play. Matches are handicapped off the low handicap player in each foursome. MEN'S FSGA INTERCLUB TEAM MATCHES

State-wide series of weekly interclub matches run by the Florida State Golf Association grouping Clubs within our local area and playing home and away matches.

DATE: 6 weekly matches from January 5th - February 9th. Playoffs: February 24th - March 17th

TEAM SIZE: Unlimited roster size - eight (8) players from your team play in each match

FORMAT: Individual Matches - Each player competes against an opponent of the same relative position on the opposing team.

Four-Ball (Best Ball) - Each player will play with a partner from his team and compete against two players from the other team

Handicaps - 100% of handicaps using each player's lowest handicap index of the previous 12 months

Players and partners will be paired according to their handicap.

ENTRY FEE: Cart Fees Only

SIGN UP: Exact Clubs and specific dates will be posted in the Men's Locker Room.

MEN'S SENIOR CHAMPIONSHIP

DATES: Round 1 - Tuesday, January 10th, Round 2 - Tuesday January 17th

TIME: AM tee times both days

ELIGIBILITY: Full Equity and NR Full Golf members

FORMAT: Individual Stableford Points (18 holes each day) Gross and Net prizes. Flights are based on age; Senior 55-74 and Super Senior 75 and above. Golf Shop credit will be issued for Overall and daily winners in each flight.

TEES: Members will play from their usual tee position. Only members playing from the white tees are eligible for gross prizes.

SIGN UP: Registration begins on Monday, December 12th and ends at 1:00pm on Sunday, January 8th. Sign ups for Day 2 will be posted in the Locker Room after completion of Day 1.

ENTRY FEE: \$25 per player plus applicable cart fees.

F&B: Members are strongly encouraged to stay for lunch. It is assumed you will be staying unless you indicate "NO" on the signup sheet. Scoring and lunch will immediately follow play both days.

MEN'S KNOCK-OUT TOURNAMENT

DATES: Year long partner match play event. Matches must be played on or before the dates listed:

1st round match - Tuesday, January 24th

2nd round match - Tuesday, February 28th

3rd round match - Tuesday March 21st

Semi-Final match - Tuesday, April 11th

FINALS - Tuesday, May 2nd

TIME: Players are responsible for making their own tee times for all matches. Finals must be played on or before Tuesday, May 2nd. Any teams not able to play during the posted time frames will have to forfeit their match.

ELIGIBILITY: Full Equity and NR Full Golf members

FORMAT: Year round team match play. Net better ball of partners in two flights. Teams will play off the low player's ball (100% handicap). Current handicaps will be used for each match. Total team indexes will determine the seeding in each flight. No qualifying round is necessary but the event is limited to the first 32 teams to sign up. Please sign up early.

TEES: Members play from their usual tee position.

SIGN UP: Registration begins on Monday, November 7th and ends at 5:00pm on Friday, December 30th.

REGISTRATION: Players will check in with the Starter to get their scorecards prior to each match.

ENTRY FEE: \$35 per player

F&B: None

MEN'S MEDAL PLAY CHAMPIONSHIP

DATES: Round 1 - Tuesday, February 21st, Round 2 - Wednesday, February 22nd

TIME: Tee times beginning at 9:15am both days.

ELIGIBILITY: Full Equity and NR Full Golf Members.

FORMAT: This is a 36 hole individual stroke play event played at scratch.

TEES: Play will be from the Championship Tee Blocks.

SIGN UP: Registration begins on Monday, January 24th and ends at 5:00pm on Friday, February 17th. Sign up in the Men's Locker Room.

ENTRY FEE: None

F&B: None. Celebratory cocktails on the Patio are encouraged after golf on Wednesday.

MEN'S SERIOUS SCRAMBLE

DATE: Tuesday, February 28th

TIME: 8:45am

ELIGIBILITY: Full Equity, and NR Full Golf, Equity Members

FORMAT: ABCD - Four-person scramble. Closest to the Pins and Longest Drives will also be awarded.

TEES: All participants will play from the Green Tees.

SIGN UP: Registration begins on Monday, January 30th and ends at 1:00pm on Friday, February 24th. Sign up in the Golf Shop. There must be even foursomes so sign up early to eliminate the chances of being on the alternate list.

ENTRY FEE: \$25 cash per player for prizes must be prepaid to the Golf Shop by Friday, February 24th.

MEN'S MEMBER-MEMBER

DATES: Tuesday, February 7th through Saturday, February 11th

TIME: Pairings Party - Tuesday, February 7th from 6:00-8:00pm. Round 1 - Thursday, February 9th, 12:30pm shotgun start and Round 2 - Saturday, February 11th, 9:30am shotgun start. Awards Dinner Dance - Saturday, February 11th, 6:00pm.

ELIGIBILITY: All Full Equity and NR Full Golf Members. Emeritus, Associate Equity and Executive members are eligible on a space available basis. The maximum men's handicap for this event is 36.

FORMAT: Pick your Partner Event. Round 1 - 18 holes of Better Ball of Partners (85% Handicap). Round 2 - 18 holes of Chapman/Pinehurst. This is a 36-hole Net Championship. Flights are determined by each team's total handicap index. All Low Net Flight Winners participate in a three-hole aggregate playoff to determine the Overall Men's Champions.

TEES: The six lowest handicapped teams will make up the Championship Flight which will play from the White tees and compete for a gross prize. All other participants will play from their usual tee position.

SIGN UP: Registration begins on January 2nd and ends at 1:00pm on Friday, February 3rd. Applications will be available in the Golf Shop.

ENTRY FEE: \$200 per player (plus tax and applicable cart and green fees) includes Pairings Party on Tuesday night (Heavy Hors d' Oeuvres and Food Stations), action stations and snacks both tournament days, daily and overall prizes and the Awards Dinner Dance on Saturday night. Non-golfing spouses and/or guests are welcome to attend the Pairings Party (\$45) and/or the Awards Dinner Dance (\$60).

F&B: Attire for both the Pairings Party and the Awards Dinner Dance is Country Club Casual. Reservations are not required for the Pairings Party but <u>are</u> required for the Awards Dinner Dance. Reservations are required for any non-golfing spouses and/or guests attending either event. Drinks and grab and go snacks will be available on-course for both tournament days.

MEN'S CLUB CHAMPIONSHIP

DATES: The first round will be played on Tuesday, March 7th, second round on Thursday, March 9th, Semi-Finals on Saturday, March 11th and Finals on Sunday, March 12th

TIME: March 7th, 9th, and 11th - AM Tee times Finals - Tee Times beginning at 1:00pm

ELIGIBILITY: Full Equity and NR Full Golf Members.

FORMAT: This is an individual match play event. All flights will be seeded based on player handicap indexes except that the defending Club Champion will get the #1 seed in the Championship Flight.

MATCHES: Rounds will be individual match play (single elimination) in flights with matches beginning on March 7th. Players will be flighted based on handicap index from low to high. The Championship Flight will play gross matches (no strokes) and all subsequent flights are handicapped, stroking off the low player in the match - 100% handicap.

TEES: The Championship Flight will play from the Championship Tee Blocks. For all other flights, Members will play from their usual tee position.

SIGN UP: Registration begins Monday, February 6th and ends at 1:00pm Friday, March 3rd. Sign up in the Men's Locker Room.

ENTRY FEE: None

JUNIOR GOLF



A "Junior Member" is the son/daughter of a golf member, at least 5 years of age and under the age of 23, living in the home of the member and attending school on a full-time basis. A junior member must abide by the Junior Golf Policy until the age of 18. Dress code applies.

A "Junior Golfer" is any golfer under the age of 18. A Junior Golfer must be registered in the golf shop by a golf member. Junior golfers requesting to play the course during peak hours must have an established handicap of 30 or less, be approved by the Golf Professional Staff and be accompanied by an adult.

Junior golfers age 12 and over may play unaccompanied, carrying their bag, after 3:00pm, subject to the discretion of the Golf Professional or authorized golf staff (see walking policy). Junior golfers must have Golf Shop permission to use the practice areas if unaccompanied. Junior golfers under age 16 who do not have a valid driver's license are not permitted to drive a golf cart on the course or on Willoughby property. Junior golfers under the age of 12 must be accompanied by an adult at all times both on the course and at the practice areas. Adults take precedence over Juniors at all times. Junior golfers are subject to all USGA and Willoughby Golf Club rules and regulations and must abide by the Club's Dress Code Policy.

Junior Clinics

Junior Clinics are offered year-round on Saturday mornings from 10:00am to 11:00am. These clinics are free to Resident Golf Members on a space available basis. Topics covered are rules, etiquette, short game, full swing, course management and fun events.

Holiday and School Break Programming

Many Juniors have the following days off so we hope they will join us for time with friends and fun skill building. Each session has a four-person minimum. Friends and guests are invited and all levels are welcome. Fees are \$75 for each session. Please register in the Golf Shop.

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ETIQUETTE 101

ARRIVAL AT THE CLUB

- Please arrive at least 30 minutes ahead of your scheduled tee time and utilize the bag drop on arrival. Our outside Services Staff will assist you.
- Locker Rooms have full changing and shower facilities. Golf and street shoe care is also available. We kindly request that everyone change clothing and shoes in the Locker Room.
- Carts and clubs will be waiting at the cart staging area outside of the Golf Shop.
- Please register in the Golf Shop and sign appropriate charge slips prior to proceeding to the first tee. The Golf Shop is open 7 days a week, 7:30am to 6:00pm from October 10th through May 7th. During the summer season, the club is closed on Tuesday's and the shop hours are 7:30am to 5:00pm.
- Equipment storage is offered at an annual fee. Inquire in the Golf Shop to make arrangements.

HOURS OF OPERATION

Pro Shop

- 7:30am to 6:00pm All days in-season (mid-October through mid-May)

PLAYING THE GAME

- Golf members are provided range balls at no charge.
- Check with the Starter for starting order.
- Arrive at the first tee, prepared to play, 15 minutes prior to your tee time.

THE SPIRIT OF THE GAME

All players are expected to play in the spirit of the game by:

- Acting with integrity, by following the Rules, applying all penalties, and being honest in all aspects of play.
- Showing consideration to others, by playing at a prompt pace, looking out for the safety of others, and not distracting the play of another player.
- Taking good care of the course for example, by replacing divots, smoothing bunkers, repairing ball-marks, and not causing unnecessary damage to the course.

SAFETY

- Players should ensure that no one is standing close by or in a position to be hit by a club, ball or any stones, pebbles, twigs or the like when they make a stroke or practice swing.
- Players should not play until the players in front are out of range.
- Players should always alert the green staff nearby or ahead when they are about to make a stroke that might endanger them.
- If a player plays a ball in a direction where there is danger of hitting someone, they should immediately shout a warning. The traditional word of warning in such a situation is "FORE".
- Observe all cart operating rules.

CONSIDERATION FOR OTHER PLAYERS

- Players should always show consideration for other players on the course and should not disturb their play by moving, talking or making unnecessary noise.
- Players should ensure that any electronic devices taken onto the course does not distract other players.
- On the teeing ground, a player should not tee their ball until it is his/her turn to play.
- Players should not stand close to or directly behind the ball, or directly behind the hole when a player is about to play.
- On the putting green, players should not cast a shadow or stand on another player's line of putt or when they are making a stroke.
- Players should remain on or close to the putting green until all other players in the group have holed out.

PACE OF PLAY

- The Pace of Play is four hours under normal playing conditions. Rangers are on the course to assist and encourage all golfers to play at the proper pace so everyone can enjoy their round.
- Please remember the importance of arriving at the first tee on time. If three members of a foursome are on time, they may be asked to tee off and have the tardy fourth player join them in the fairway.
- If the entire group fails to arrive on time, you have missed your tee time and will be required to wait for the next available opening.
- If a group has fallen behind and is unable to regain the proper position, the Ranger may have these groups skip a hole in order to regain their proper position on the golf course.
- If you hit a shot that may be lost or out-of-bounds, play a provisional ball to save time.
- The Rules of Golf only allows you a maximum of three minutes to search for a lost ball.
- It is a group's responsibility to keep up with the group in front. If you have an open hole ahead and you are delaying the group behind you, you should invite the group behind to play through (irrespective of the number of players in that group).
- Players should be ready to play as soon as it is their turn to play. When playing on or near the putting green, carts should be left in a position that will enable quick movement off the green and towards the next tee.

CARE OF THE COURSE

- Keep all 4 wheels on the cart paths at all tees and greens.
- Take good care of the course by replacing divots, repairing ball-marks, and not causing unnecessary damage to the course.
- Repair any damage to the putting green made by the impact of a ball (whether made by you or someone else) or damage to the putting green caused by golf shoes.
- Players should avoid causing damage to the course by removing divots when taking practice swings or by hitting the head of a club into the ground, whether in anger or for any other reason.
- Please fill divots with the sand that is provided.
- Before leaving a bunker, players should carefully fill up and smooth over all holes and footprints made by them and any nearby made by others.
- The head of the rake should be placed IN the bunker with the Willoughby Golf | 19

handle a few inches outside the bunker.

- In order to avoid damaging the hole, the head of a club should not be used to remove a ball from the hole.
- Please do not drive golf carts between the green and red balls short of the greens that are on either side of each fairway. Carts should exit the fairways to the side of the hole that has the green ball and proceed to the closest section of cart path outside of the green ball. Under no circumstances are carts permitted to exit the fairway on the side that has the red ball nor are you permitted to drive around the red ball to approach the green. Golfers may park their carts short of the red ball to play a shot beyond, but then must drive to the side of the hole with the green ball to exit the fairway as described above.
- "Arrows Only" days are days where the course is open but too wet to allow unrestricted cart movement. On those days, all members (including those with handicap flags), must drive their carts strictly along the painted arrows and pay careful attention to the signs that will also direct cart traffic away from wet areas.

Players are NOT permitted to drive their carts along the arrows to a point equal to where their ball is and then leave the arrows close to the ball. If this rule presents a significant hardship, it is recommended that the player not play on "Arrows Only" days.

• Leave the course in better condition than you found it.

COMPLETING THE ROUND

- Return carts to the staging area. Staff will clean clubs and place them in your vehicle or storage area.
- Complete scorecards in full including player names, date of play, assigned tee times and tees played. Ensure all player scores are posted in GHIN and drop the scorecard, signed and dated by you and attested by another player in your group, into the receptacles provided in the Golf Shop, Men's Locker Room and Cabana.

TIPPING

• WGC permits tipping to Outside Golf Services and to Locker Room staff.

GENERAL RULES

TEE TIMES

In season, tee times are determined by lottery. Tee time requests may be submitted via on-line requests or by completing tee time cards and depositing them in designated boxes in the Men's and Ladies' Locker Rooms. Accurate information regarding all players in the foursome along with requested date and preferred times should be completed in full.

Tee times will be made at 10:00am, four days in advance of the play date. After tee times are drawn, you will be emailed a confirmation with your assigned time. In addition, tee sheets are available on the Willoughby website.

Tee times may be made after the lottery is drawn by calling the Starter's office at 220-0083 or the Golf Shop at 220-1192.

- Please register all players, including guests.
- Fivesomes are NOT permitted.
- Observe any course information that may be posted on the #1 and #10 tees.
- If you miss your tee time, you will be required to wait for the next available opening.
- Please call the Golf Shop as far in advance as possible to cancel a tee time.

HANDICAP PROCEDURES

The purpose of the USGA Handicap System is to make the game of golf more enjoyable by enabling players of differing abilities to compete on an equitable basis. It provides a fair Course Handicap for each player, regardless of ability, and adjusts a player's Handicap Index up or down as the player's game changes.

In order to participate in WGC tournaments, members must have an active USGA approved handicap. To establish a handicap, a 20 | Willoughby Golf member must have turned in a minimum of five scores. It is the responsibility of each member to post an accurate score for each acceptable round of golf played. Do not post scores when you play in a scramble format or in a competition limiting the number of clubs used, or when the player plays alone. The golf staff is responsible for posting all Tournament scores and Men's and Ladies Day scores.

The WGC Handicap Committee has the responsibility of making certain that each player has a Handicap that reflects their potential ability. They utilize the Golfhits software program which interfaces with the tee sheet to determine if a score was posted for each round of golf played. Please be sure to notify the Starter or Golf Shop before you tee off if you or your foursome is playing a format that is non-postable.

A score must be posted for every round played. Post a 9-hole score when you play 7-13 holes. Post an 18-hole score when you play 14 or more holes. Add a "Net Par" for any holes not played. Post all scores, both home and away. You must include scores even when you haven't completed one or more holes or when you are asked to pick up when you are out of a hole. Record the most likely score as long as it doesn't exceed the maximum number (net double bogey) you are allowed to post based on your individual handicap.

Please see one of our golf professionals if you do not understand any of the handicap procedures or are unsure of how to calculate unplayed holes.

GHIN (Golf Handicap Information Network)

This is a service established by the USGA to provide handicaps for players at subscribing golf clubs and associations.

You may also post scores by visiting GHIN's website at http:// www.GHIN.com. Click the yellow "Post Scores" link near the top

of the page, enter your GHIN number and last name and click the "Continue" button. Then add the appropriate information concerning your round of golf (Date of play, Home or Away course, number of holes played, Course played, Tees played, ESC score).

There are several other things you can do on the GHIN website, including:

- Creating a profile. This will enable you to easily view your score history and handicap history and run a variety of reports.
- View your current Handicap Index or review other player's statistics.

You may also download the GHIN app to your iPhone, iPad or Android device for quick and easy score posting.

SAFETY

In the event of an emergency, dial 911 and then call Security at (772) 288-1716.

THORGUARD LIGHTNING DETECTION SYSTEM

Thorguard constantly monitors and measures the electrostatic activity in the environment at a distance of up to 20 miles away. As conditions in the atmosphere change or become charged, Thorguard will go through status changes that let us know of the potential for strikes in the area. An "All Clear" reading means that the atmosphere is stable. A "Caution" reading means that the energy in the atmosphere is changing and a "Warning" reading means that the energy in the atmosphere is building. The "Red Alert" reading means that safety has been compromised and the potential for lightning has been detected in the area. Once "Red Alert" status has been reached, a 15 second long blast of the horn is initiated. At this point, anyone who is outside must seek shelter immediately.

Once the atmospheric activity stabilizes and reaches an "All Clear" status, the system will sound three short blasts of the siren. At this point, it is safe to go back out to the golf course and resume play.

The Thorguard webpage can be accessed by computer, tablet, or most smartphones. To access the webpage, simply type in the following address in your browser search bar: 360.thormobile.net/willoughbygolfclub/

GOLF CARTS

Privately owned carts must be approved by the club as complying with the appearance and other standards set forth herein and as may be determined from time to time by the Club. The Club currently requires all privately owned golf carts to be of traditional manufacture, four-wheel construction, have a top, be electrically operated, equipped with head and tail lights, horn and sand bucket. All carts must be kept clean, neat and freshly painted. Approved colors are white, beige and grey.

An annual trail fee, at a rate established by the Club, is required for privately owned golf carts. The trail fee is non-refundable.

• An individual must be 16 years of age and have a driver's license

to operate.

- A maximum of 2 people/2 bags per cart is allowed.
- Observe all cart operating rules and course guidelines.
- Only two carts are permitted in each foursome and/or per tee time.
- Using the cart paths as much as possible will help minimize wear and tear on the course.
- Disabled flags can be obtained from the Starter. Procedures are listed below.
- All fleet carts must be returned to the cart barn by the end of the day.

HANDICAPPED PLAYERS

The Club recognizes the need to allow members with physical impairments to be able to approach our greens in their golf carts to a point closer than it allows members who are without physical impairments to approach the greens. At the same time, the club needs to do what it can within reason to protect the golf course turf from undue wear in the areas around the greens so that all members will be able to play from the best possible turf. Accordingly, the club has created a program for Handicapped Players and has issued guidelines for the benefit of all such members.

Any member with a physical impairment who desires to take advantage of this program should request a Handicap Flag from a member of the Professional Staff in the Golf Shop. Handicap flags will be issued on a temporary basis or on an annual basis. In order to obtain a temporary or annual flag, a handicap parking placard issued by the Florida (or your home state) Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles must be presented to a member of the Professional Staff. Each member receiving a Handicap Flag will receive a copy of the Handicap Player guidelines and accompanying illustrations of where carts can and cannot park. A member of the Professional Staff will review the guidelines and accompanying illustrations with each member that receives a Handicap Flag. Each member that receives a Handicap Flag will be asked to sign a form acknowledging receipt of the numbered flag and the guidelines. Handicap Flags will only be issued by a member of the Professional Staff in the Golf Shop. It is recommended that an appointment be scheduled with a member of the Professional Staff to ensure that a proper allotment of time is given to go over the guidelines and illustrations.

Handicap flags are issued on a temporary basis for as long as the impairment exists or on an annual basis for members with permanent disabilities. This is determined by the expiration date on the member's handicap parking placard. Whether the disability is temporary or permanent, all flags must be turned in by the expiration date on their handicap parking placard or at the end of the season (September 30th) whichever comes first. Handicap Flags will be reissued at the start of the following season (October 1st) for those who need them.

The benefit conveyed by issuing a flag to a handicapped player does NOT apply on "Arrows Only" days. Arrows Only days are days where the course is open but too wet to allow unrestricted cart

movement. On those days, all members including handicapped players, must drive their carts strictly along the painted arrows and pay attention to the signs that will also direct the cart traffic away from wet areas. If this rule presents a significant hardship, it is recommended that the player not play on Arrows Only days.

Members are not allowed under any circumstances to purchase their own Handicap Flags for use on the golf course.

TRAIL PLAN

Resident Members may purchase an annual Trail Plan which gives them the right to use their privately owned golf carts on the golf course without payment of golf cart fees.

NR Full Golf and Executive Members may also purchase an annual Trail Plan which gives them privileges to use the Club's cart on the golf course without payment of golf cart fees.

A maximum of two riders per day are included with each Trail Fee Plan. Generally, this allows both the member and spouse to play each day without having to pay a cart fee. However, if the spouse doesn't play golf on a given day and the member plays with a guest, the guest's cart fee will be waived. If the member plays with a guest and the spouse plays golf that day, the guest will be charged a cart fee.

WALKING THE COURSE

Walking is restricted to times after 3:00pm or on days that the course is designated walking only due to rain and is subject to the discretion of the Golf Professional or Golf Shop staff. Please tune to Channel 63 or inquire at the Golf Shop. All walking golfers must check in with the Golf Shop prior to the start of each round and start on Hole #1.

Members may utilize push carts during the above times. They should remain on the cart path near the tee boxes and should never be brought closer than 30 feet to the green. Upon completion of the hole, players using push carts shall return to the golf cart path. Members must supply their own push carts. Push carts may not be motorized and wheels must be a minimum of 3 inches in width. Only single bag push carts are permitted. The Golf Staff can recommend push cart models that are in compliance with this policy.

Junior Members age 12 and over may play unaccompanied golf by walking and carrying their own bags.

DRESS CODE

For men, shorts must be Bermuda length. Shirts must have a collar or mock turtleneck (as approved by the PGA Tour), sleeves and be tucked in. Jeans, denim or cargo shorts, cut-offs, gym shorts, tee shirts and tank tops are not permitted. This policy applies to all areas of the golf course, including the driving range and putting green.

For ladies, shorts and skirts must be Bermuda length (below fingertip length). If a shirt has no collar, it must have sleeves or if sleeveless, it must have a jeweled neckline resting on the collarbone with a finished edge (a small V is acceptable). Over blouses must cover the waistband. Denim apparel of any color, crop tops, tank tops, cut-offs and short shorts are not permitted.

No advertising slogans across the chest or back are permitted. Tennis attire is not appropriate on the golf course.

This dress code is mandatory for all players, including children and guests. Improperly dressed golfers will be asked to change before playing. If you are in doubt concerning your attire, please check with the Golf Shop before starting play. Any misuse or disregard of these rules can cause privileges to be reviewed or suspended.

Willoughby Golf Club is a soft spike only golf club. All players are required to use an alternative spike system such as soft spikes or spikeless shoes. Spider spikes are not permitted. Conventional metal spikes can be switched to soft spikes in either locker room. Always use caution when wearing soft spikes and walking on wet wood, steep slopes and hard smooth surfaces such as concrete, rocks, tile, marble and hardwood floors.

HOLE-IN-ONE POLICY

Each golf membership is billed \$20.00 at the beginning of the season to create a "Hole-In-One" fund. When a hole-in-one occurs, the Golf Shop is notified and they contact the Men's Locker Room and The Point. All golfing members are part of the "Hole-In-One" club and are entitled to a free drink on the day the hole-in-one is scored. If the member has a guest that played golf on that day, he/ she is also entitled to a free drink. If a guest of a golf member has a hole-in-one at Willoughby, he/she and the foursome are entitled to a free drink, but not the entire membership The Willoughby golf member or guest who has a hole-in-one receives a plaque, which comes from the hole-in-one fund, and a small plaque will be placed on the bench of the hole where the hole-in-one also receives a \$250 gift certificate to the Golf Shop.

When the fund is depleted, each golf membership will be billed \$20.00 to replenish the fund. The fund does carry over to the next season.

GUEST POLICY

Members may invite guests to the Club. However, from October 1st through September 30th (fiscal year), there is a limit of six times an individual guest can be invited to play golf.

A house guest may play more than six times during the fiscal year, paying the prevailing guest fees and cart fees each time provided he/she is a house guest for no more than 14 consecutive days. Members should request a guest pass for their house guests at the Administration Office of the Club.

GENERAL RULES

FAMILY GUEST POLICY

Each family guest of a Full Equity, Executive Equity or NR Full Golf Member who resides in excess of 100 miles from the Club may play a total of six times during the fiscal year without charge. Each family member of an Equity Associate member who resides in excess of 100 miles from the Club may play a total of six times during the fiscal year paying the same guest and cart fees as the sponsoring member. Beginning with the seventh and all subsequent rounds in the same fiscal year, each family member will be charged the prevailing family guest and cart fees.

Family is defined as sons/daughters, brothers/sisters, mothers/ fathers, in-laws and grandchildren.

All family guests must be registered prior to playing. Register your guests in the Golf Shop by stopping by or by emailing proshop@

willoughbygolfclub.com. The following information will be required when registering your family guests: Member Name and number, Family Guest's name, address, phone number and relationship to member.

RAIN CHECK POLICY

When your round is shortened by rain, please report to the Golf Shop to receive your rain check. Rain checks may only be issued in the Golf Shop by golf personnel.

For members and guests; full credit is given if less than 6 holes are played. Half credit is given if less than 12 holes are played.

Tournament Play–Every effort will be made to complete all scheduled activities. When this is not possible, a resolution on a case-by-case basis shall occur.

LOCAL RULES

- 1 Environmentally sensitive areas on Holes #2, #4, #13, #15, #17 and #18 are identified by red stakes with green tops and are to be played as red penalty areas. Entrance to these areas is prohibited. If your ball rests outside of the penalty area and your stance or swing is affected due to the environmentally sensitive area, you must take relief, one-club length, no nearer the hole - No Penalty.
- 2 Waste bunkers are located on Hole #2 along the marsh and in front of Hole #16. Club may be grounded.
- 3. Bulkheads on holes #8, #9, #12, and #13 are considered obstructions and are not part of the penalty area. Relief may be taken if your ball is not in the hazard.
- 4. The drop area on Hole #12 may be used as another drop option for any ball entering the penalty area; one stroke penalty.
- 5. If a ball lies in the General Area and a sprinkler head on the line of play is within two club-lengths of the putting green and within two club-lengths of the ball, the player may take free relief by dropping the original ball or another ball within one

club-length of the nearest point of complete relief that is not nearer the hole, avoids the intervention and is in the General Area. The ball may be cleaned when lifted.

- 6. There is no penalty when a player *accidentally* causes his ball or ball-marker to move on the putting green, (see Rule 13.1.d) no matter how it happens. The moved ball or ball-marker must be replaced. This only applies when the player's ball or ball-marker lies on the putting green and any movement is accidental.
- 7. Out of bounds is defined by roadways and white stakes. Any ball coming to rest on or beyond Doubleton Drive or Haig Point is out of bounds, even if it comes to rest on another part of the course that is in bounds.
- 8. If a player does not know whether his or her ball is in the penalty area in the wetlands to the right on Hole #18, the player may play a provisional ball under Rule18.3. If the original ball is deemed to be lost in the wetlands, the provisional ball will become the ball in play. You may not proceed under Rule 17 once you have played this provisional ball.
